- ➔ On it, you'll learn everything from how to give presentations to how to convey information in the best way to different people.
- ➔ At the end of the course, you could end up working in your local community, perhaps in a community centre or knocking on people's doors telling them about how they can better access local community services.
- ➔ Or you could do something completely different with the training.
- ➔ Run by the charity CITE, on behalf of Camden Council's employment service Camden Working, we're looking for people with real life experience who are eager to improve their own and other people's lives.

Five reasons to enrol on Community Enablers

- 1 **You'll get practical training** with a supervised work placement.
- 2 **You can get qualifications.** After completing the course, there will be the opportunity to take your NVQ Level 2 in information, advice and guidance.
- 3 **You'll improve your** listening, information giving and communication **skills.**
- 4 **You won't be out of pocket.** We can make a contribution to childcare and travel expenses while you're on the course.
- 5 **It's fun.** You'll gain loads of confidence working with people from different backgrounds.

- In 2008, eight people on the Community Enablers course enrolled on the NVQ Level 2 in information, advice and guidance.
- More than half of those who enrolled on the 2007 and 2008 Community Enablers courses went into further education or employment.
